Evaluation of OR

Regular Period

The evaluation of the OR course consists of two elements: one written exam (Exam) and several exercises during the classes (Exercises). The students' final grade will be the weighted sum of both elements (if it benefits the students) or simply the grade of the Exam. That is, the students' final grade in the regular period is computed as follows:

Final Grade = $max{Exam ; 0.8 \times Exam + 0.2 \times Exercises}$

To get approval in the OR course, the *Final Grade* must be greater than or equal to 9.5.

More details:

Final Exam (Exam)

- It will be on 12th December.
- The exam will cover all six chapters.
- Students can bring 1 A4 sheet (both sides) with personal notes.
- Calculators are not allowed.
- Students must bring exam paper to write their answers.

Extra exercises (*Exercises*)

- The exercises will be done during the classes.
- The days on which the exercises are done are not communicated in advance.
- Each exercise will last no longer than 15 minutes.
- The total number of exercises can vary between 4 and 6.
- If a student does not attend to an exercise, his/her grade on it is zero.
- The exercise with the worst grade is excluded, and the remaining ones will contribute equally to the final value of the component *Exercises*.

Repeat Period

All students who don't get approval in the regular period are automatically enrolled in the exam of the repeated period. For those students, the final grade's formula used in the regular period is also used in the repeated period, replacing in that formula the exam of the regular period with the exam of the repeat period. Students who obtained approval in the regular period can also take this exam to improve their final mark; however, it is mandatory to register for it, and the component *Exercises* is not considered in the computation of the final grade.

- The exam covers all six chapters of the course.
- Students can bring 1 A4 sheet (both sides) with personal notes.
- Calculators are not allowed.
- Students must bring exam paper to write their answers.

Final marks above 17

The students obtaining a final mark higher than 17 – either on the regular period or in the repeated period – may be subject to a complementary exam.
