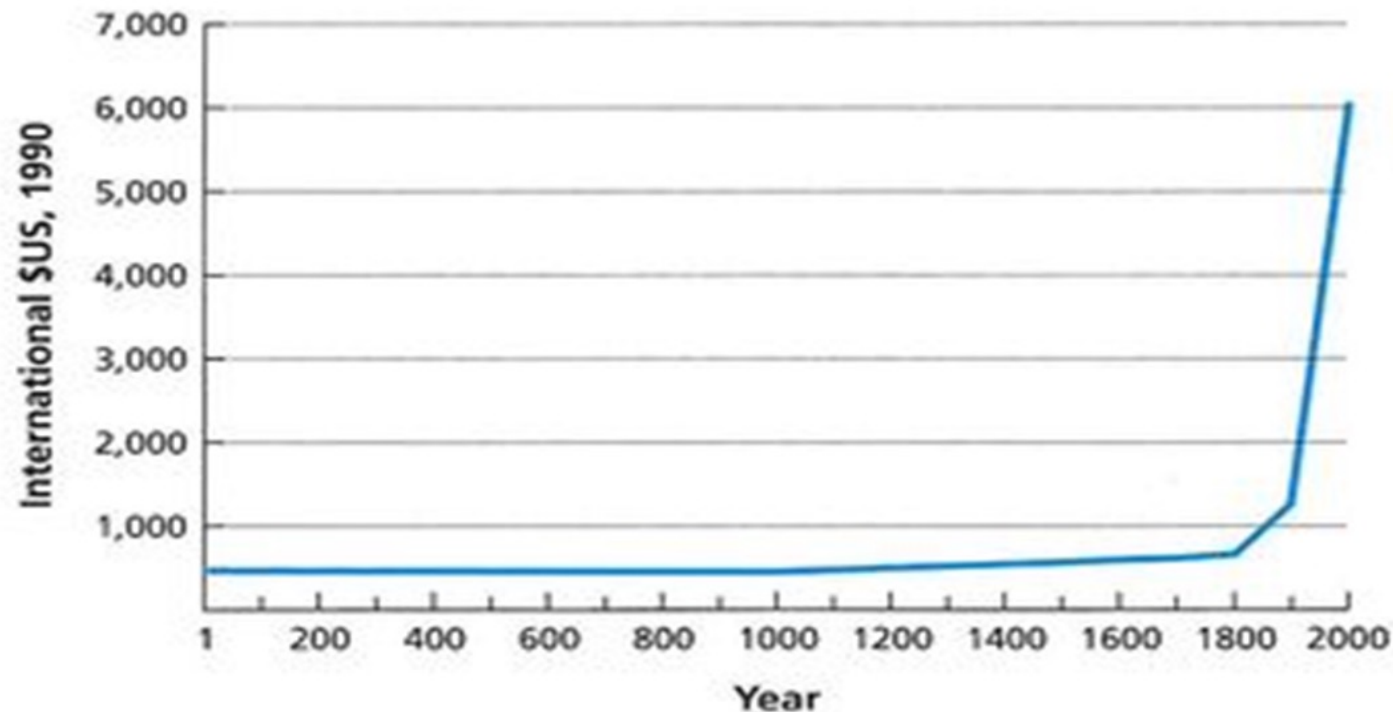

# Grades (max = 20 pts)

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## METHOD A:

- **8 pts** come from group work assessments during term (best 6 out of 8)
- **12 pts** from individual written tests (4 from one mini-test and 8 from one final test)
