WHAT WILL YOU GAIN FROM TAKING THIS COURSE?

- **You will have a chance to apply the knowledge you have acquired throughout your degree in the development of theoretically-driven, small-scale research project;**
- **You will be able to gain deeper knowledge of a topic of your interest;**
- **You will get a first experience on how to conduct a (small) research project - on which you will be able to build on if you decide to pursue your studies to a post-graduate level (MSc or PhD).**

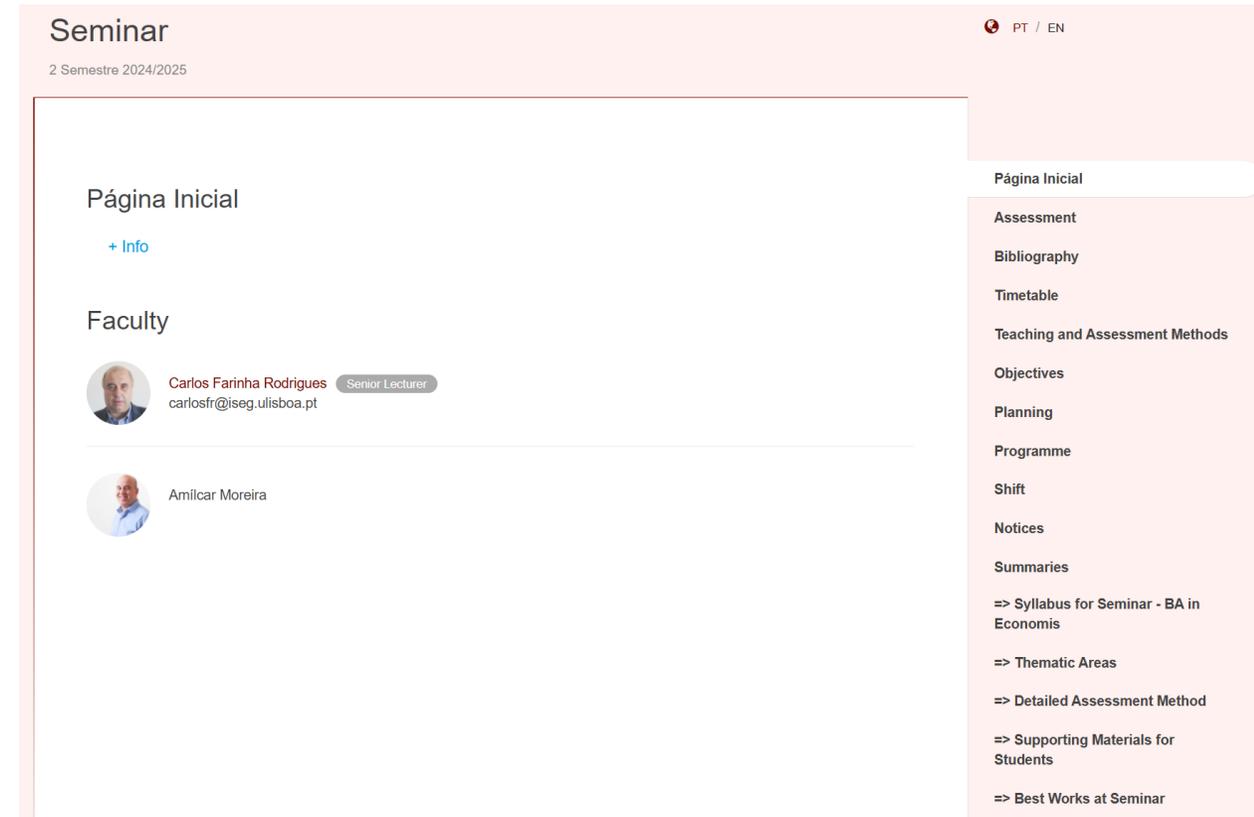

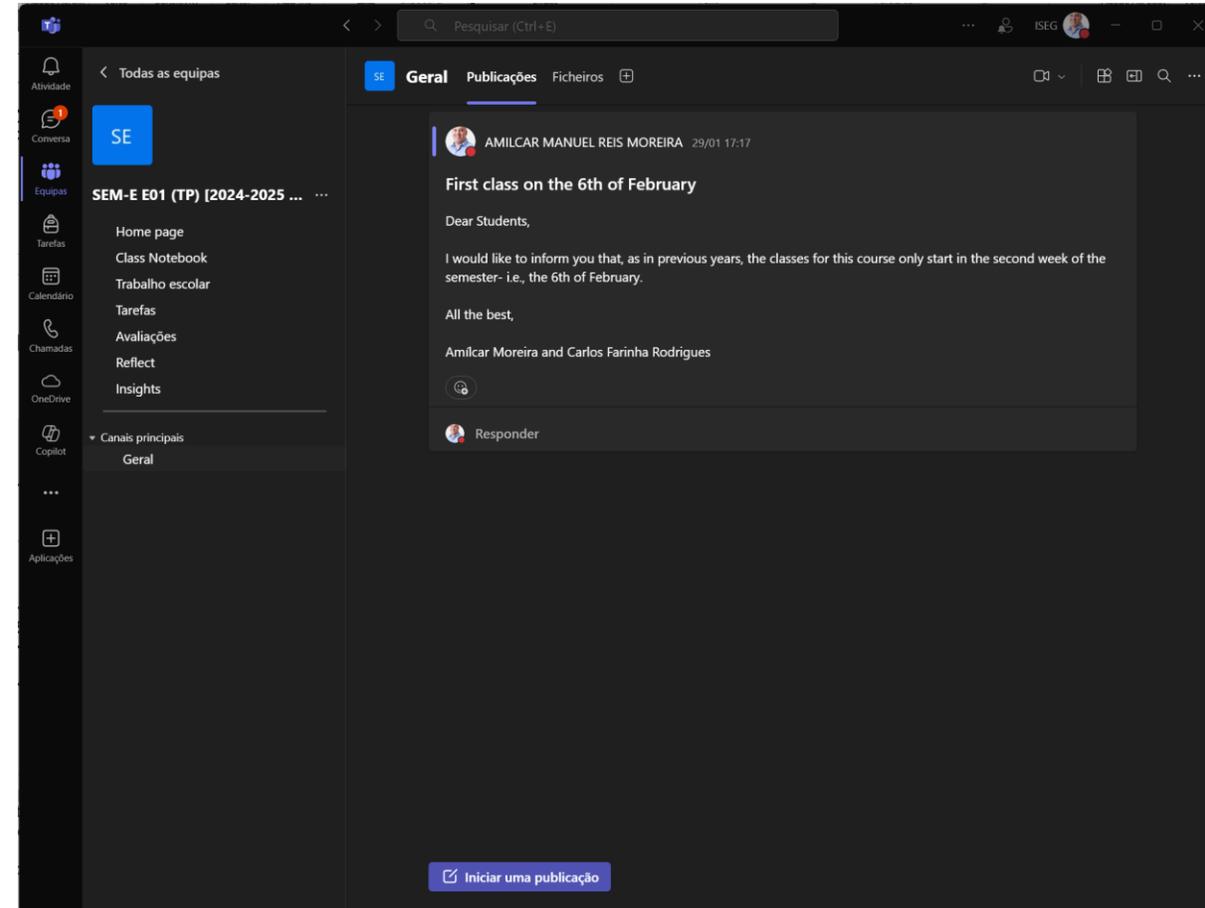

HOW WILL YOUR PROGRESS BE MONITORED?

- **Plenary Session Memo**
 - **Aim: Students are expected to provide a brief description of the contents of Plenary Session 1 , and reflect on how the contents of this plenary session will help them in the development of their research project**
 - **Which Sessions:**
 - **Plenary Session II**
 - **Plenary Session III**
 - **Length: No more than 2 pages (A4).**

HOW WILL YOUR PROGRESS BE MONITORED?

- **Preliminary Report**
 - **This Report has two aims:**
 - **Provide a brief description the topic of the project and the methodological approach that will be adopted;**
 - **Showcase the first outputs of the group's literature search.**

HOW WILL YOUR PROGRESS BE MONITORED?

- **Preliminary Report**
 - **Cover**
 - **Topic;**
 - **Members of the group (name and student ID number);**
 - **Tutor.**
 - **Research Proposal (1 page), which should cover the following topics:**
 - **Aim - Specify the aim of the research project;**
 - **Justification - Specify why the topic you chose is relevant. Provide empirical evidence to support your argument;**
 - **Methodology - Briefly specify the methodological approach that will be used to address the topic;**
 - **Bibliography (identify key references)**

HOW WILL YOUR PROGRESS BE MONITORED?

- **Progress Report**
 - **This Report is expected to provide a preview of what the ‘Final Report’ will look like:**
 - **The title, which should provide a clear definition of the topic;**
 - **A Table of Contents, which should mirror that of the ‘Final Report’;**
 - **An outline of the ‘Final Report’, including a clear description of the methodology that will be adopted;**
 - **A list of bibliographic references that is very close to final.**

HOW WILL YOUR PROGRESS BE MONITORED?

- **Progress Report**
 - **The Report should be structured as follows:**
 - **Cover**
 - **Topic;**
 - **Members of the group;**
 - **Tutor.**
 - **Table of Contents (1 Page)**
 - **Introduction, which should cover the following topics:**
 - **Aim - Specify the aim of the research project;**
 - **Justification - Specify why the topic you chose is relevant. Provide empirical evidence to support your argument;**
 - **Outline of the 'Final Report' (at the least one paragraph per each section of the Table of Contents).**
 - **Bibliography**

HOW WILL YOUR PROGRESS BE MONITORED?

- **Submission of Assignments**
 - **With the exception of Plenary Session Memos, assignments should be previously discussed with and approved by the tutor before submission.**
 - **Assignments (Plenary Session Memos, Reports) will be submitted via MS-Teams**
 - **The lecturer will create a ‘Task’ where one member of the group will submit the Group’s assignment.**
 - **Formatting rules:**
 - **Font: Times New Roman, size 11.**
 - **Line spacing: 1.5 lines.**
 - **Margins: 2,5 * 2,5 * 25 * 2,5 cm**

HOW WILL YOU BE EVALUATED?

- **As part of the evaluation for this Course Unit, students will be assessed by reference to :**
 - a) Participation in Seminar sessions, including presence and active participation in scheduled activities;**
 - b) Quality of the Final Report;**
 - c) Quality of the presentation and discussion of the Final Report during the Public Examination.**

HOW WILL YOU BE EVALUATED?

- **Final Report, which should cover the following topics:**
 - **Front Cover;**
 - **Table of Contents;**
 - **Body of Work**
 - **The Introduction;**
 - **Theoretical Framework**
 - **Methodology**
 - **Key Findings;**
 - **The Conclusion;**
 - **Bibliography;**
 - **If relevant, some Annexes.**
- **The main body of Final Report (Introduction, Body of Work and Conclusion) must not exceed 25 pages, and the entire report (including the Table of Contents, Bibliography and Annexes) cannot exceed 50 pages.**

USE OF AI TOOLS DURING THE COURSE

- The use of AI tools is permitted **solely for auxiliary purposes**, namely:
 - Bibliographic searches;
 - Linguistic support;
 - Preliminary organization of ideas;
 - Conceptual clarification;
 - Exploratory data analysis.

- **Under no circumstances may AI tools be used to produce, in whole or in part, the written Reports** or to replace the student's independent intellectual contribution.
